FACTS	WHAT DOES KENSICO CAPITAL MANAGEMENT CORP. (“KENSICO”) DO WITH YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION?
Why?	Financial companies choose how they share your personal information. Federal law gives consumers the right to limit some but not all sharing. Federal law also requires us to tell you how we collect, share, and protect your personal information. Please read this notice carefully to understand what we do.
What?	<p>The types of personal information we collect and share depend on the product or service you have with us. This information can include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Social security number, income and net worth; ■ account balances and wire transfer instructions; ■ credit scores and assets; <p>When you are <i>no longer</i> our customer, we continue to share your information as described in this notice.</p>
How?	All financial companies need to share customers’ personal information to run their everyday business. In the section below, we list the reasons financial companies can share their customers’ personal information; the reasons Kensico chooses to share; and whether you can limit this sharing.

What we do

How does Kensico protect my personal information?	To protect your personal information from unauthorized access and use, we use security measures that comply with federal law. These measures include computer safeguards and secured files and buildings. We restrict access to personal information about you to our employees and service providers who need to know that information to provide products or services to you.
How does Kensico collect my personal information?	<p>We collect your personal information, for example, when you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ give us your contact information; ■ open an account; ■ make deposits or withdrawals from your account; ■ give us your income and net worth information; ■ tell us where to send the money; and <p>We may collect your personal information from others, such as credit bureaus, affiliates, or other companies.</p>
Why can't I limit all sharing?	<p>Federal law gives you the right to limit only</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ sharing for affiliates' everyday business purposes— information about your creditworthiness ■ affiliates from using your information to market to you ■ sharing for nonaffiliates to market to you <p>State laws and individual companies may give you additional rights to limit sharing.</p>

Affiliates	<p>Companies related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Our affiliates include financial companies such as Kensico Associates, LP; Kensico Capital, LLC; Kensico Offshore Fund, Ltd.; Kensico Offshore Fund Master, Ltd.; Kensico Offshore Fund II, Ltd.; Kensico Offshore Fund II Master, Ltd.; Kensico Partners, LP; MCK Opportunity I LP; MCK Opportunity I, LLC and Kensico Offshore I LLC.
Nonaffiliates	<p>Companies not related by common ownership or control. They can be financial and nonfinancial companies.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Nonaffiliates we share with can include administrators, legal counsel, auditors and tax advisors.
Joint marketing	<p>A formal agreement between nonaffiliated financial companies that together market financial products or services to you.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ■ Kensico doesn't jointly market.
